### McCrory in the Middle

The big news in Raleigh this week was Governor McCrory's veto of Senate Bill 2, which would have allowed magistrates to opt out of performing gay marriages and House Bill 405 - also known as "ag-gag" - for its penalties for corporate and agricultural whistleblowers. Read about the implications of these actions for the rest of this session.

While the vetoes are important, the implications for the rest of the legislative session could be even more so. McCrory's actions and his aggressive lobbying for his infrastructure bond plan may indicate a growing willingness to take on legislators from his own party – as well as preparations for his 2016 reelection efforts, which many believe will require a move to the center.

What that means for the rest of this session is still unclear. Will McCrory veto more bills? Will the right wing of his party attack him – and those who follow him – for doing so? Will the General Assembly over-ride a veto and attempt to show the Governor who's boss?

### Money, Money, Money

A tentative timeline for the Senate's budget process was released this week. The Senate Appropriations and Finance committees will hear the budget on Tuesday, 6/9; votes on the floor would be 6/10 and 6/11. While we're waiting for the details, the <u>NC Conservation Network</u> has a good summary of environmental provisions in the House version of the budget.

#### **Holy Hunting**

House Bill 640, the Outdoor Heritage Act, prompted some lively debate concerning Sunday hunting. Social conservatives argued that the bill would dishonor the Sabbath, and the NRA argued that not allowing hunting on Sunday violated private property rights. After the spirited debate, the bill passed the Senate Agriculture & Environment Committee and later the full Senate.
